
An Introduction to Youth Engagement in Maquoketa

## Background: Youth in Maquoketa

### The Issue

In the City of Maquoketa there is a lack of youth leadership and engagement. Current young people in the city are not actively engaged in their community.



Youth Advisory Council

The State of Iowa Youth Advisory Council

- Engaged youth between the **ages of 14 and 20** 
  - Youth leaders **selected to represent Iowa youth** and **engage in topics important** to young Iowans.



Youth Exploration and Skill Development

Bay Cove Academy Job Shadow Program

- Poll the students about their career interests
- Provides both **school-wide and individualized job shadowing** opportunities





#### New Curriculum Guides on Engaging with Youth

Des Moines Led Workshops

• Guide young people through activities to think critically about their neighborhoods and identify pathways to realize those goals

## **Policy Recommendations**



## Accessibility

- Bridging the gap between existing opportunities and youth.
- Ensuring that current opportunities are attainable and visible for all youth in Maquoketa.
- Ex: Creating a youth opportunity and advancement section of high traffic websites.



## Expansion

- Refining the programs already in place and conducting a SWAT analysis to improve programs.
- Further developing the Youth Advisor Committee and expanding their responsibilities.
- Ex: Technology leaders



## Youth Opportunities in Maguoketa City Council

- Increasing youth involvement in Maquoketa City Council.
- Establishing Student Liaisons to represent the youth voice.



## Where We Are Headed (Next Steps)

## Accessibility:

- Create Youth
  Opportunities and
  Advancement Sections
- Gather resources, tools, and future opportunities that could be useful to students

## Expansion:

 Expand on the roles and responsibilities of the Youth Advisory Committee to include roles with an emphasis technology

## Student Liaison:

Find a sustainable way to find qualified students to be involved.

## Conduct a Survey:

- This will allow the youth to communicate on the wants and needs of Maquoketa Youth.
- Gather questions that would result in meaningful feedback.



## **Survey Questions**

- What extracurricular activities ulletare you involved in?
- What careers would you like to pursue upon graduation?
- What leadership or mentorship opportunities do you wish were available to you?
