
Greenspace

Incorporate greenspace during street reconstruction

Develop healthy, productive lowmaintenance greenspaces

Clean and remediate greenspace soil

Enhance existing greenspace to provide increased services



Biodiversity

Ensure a diverse vegetative populations

No one tree species should make up more than 10% of all trees

Establish networks of greenspace to support biodiversity



Access & Networks

Prioritize areas of high resident, employee, and visitor densities

Create ADA-accessible greenspaces

Utilize riparian areas as natural greenspaces



Funding

Establish a greenspace fund

Reevaluate the current stormwater fee

Partner with private property owners

Incentivize greenspace implementation



Education

Conduct tours, workshops, trainings, and grand openings

Install educational signage

Utilize media to educate

SHORT

- Total greenspace acres increase

- Plan is incorporated within Sioux City Comprehensive Plan


INTERMEDIATE























Downtown Partners Streetscaping Expenditure Totals
